Rick: Remember the men's Bible study that I have been leading for some of the men from Sembradores Church? When we left to come on Home Ministry Assignment, it was down to three students, but they were very enthusiastic, and had made tremendous progress in their reading skills. Thanks for praying!

Many of you were praying for the literacy program we had hoped to set up at El Tejar Church, and shared our disappointment when that did not materialize for this year. However, God in his grace has opened another door for this ministry when he closed that one. The men in our Bible study, when they saw the literacy materials we had prepared, and reflected on the progress that they themselves had made in reading, got enthusiastic about the idea of setting up their own literacy program, using these materials, at Sembradores Church. We were not available to train them to be literacy teachers, since we are on our Home Ministry Assignment, but several experienced members of our team in Ecuador got excited

After the program is completed, these teachers will begin teaching classes to many of the members at Sembradores Church who cannot read or do not read well. After that program gets going well, their vision is to take the same program back to their home village in Chimborazo province, and set up a program there. And after that, only the Lord knows!

Gultural Gloseup

Betty: This year, we have the joy of celebrating Christmas with family in the United States. As a family, we celebrate Christmas in Ecuador much the same as we do here. Most Ecuadorians have Christmas trees, a big feast, and gifts, very much like we do.

But Quichua culture is quite different. Christmas is not a big celebration among the Quichuas. In fact, they don't make a big deal about most other holidays or birthdays, either (except for Carnaval and

the Day of the Dead, as explained in a previous newsletter). Giving gifts is not a big part of their traditions. Many of the

older Quichuas don't even know when they were born or how old they are. One thing the Quichuas celebrate big, though: weddings. The whole community is invited and everyone is fed plenty. In fact, it's the duty of the groom's family to provide a full meal for every person— more than any one person can eat. The Quichuas each bring a container to the wedding to take food home. If you don't eat it all, you are expected to take it home. It's an insult not to. Some missionaries told me several years ago that they sneak the food into a "take home" bag. But we found out that you don't have to sneak. The Quichuas don't expect you to eat that much and are honored if you want to take their food home.
