

But now we really need those pledges as we get ready for our big move back to Ecuador. We will also need about \$8500 in one-time donations for the expenses of the move.

Betty: Now that Rick is a pastor, he will most likely be called on to perform weddings. In the U.S., just being an ordained pastor allows him to legally marry a couple. But it is a little different in most of Latin America. In Ecuador a church wedding doesn't

carry any legal weight with the government, and in Colombia the paper-work is so complicated that few pastors bother getting registered. A couple has to be married in a civil service. This usually takes place a few days before the church wedding so that everything is done legally when the church blesses the union. There are probably a lot less couples who back out at the altar if they've already tied the knot in the government's eyes!
