Cultural Closeup

Our car here in Ecuador is quite old, a 1995 Chevrolet Trooper. And lately it has been in the shop a lot, costing quite a bit of money. On the other hand, vehicles here cost more than they do in the U.S., and used vehicles tend to hold their value here better. We bought it for \$9000 from friends 7 years ago, and in the current market we could probably still get at least \$8000 for it. So we just keep fixing it!

One reason we have to make sure everything continues to work on it is that Ecuador requires all vehicles to have a mechanical inspection once a year, and pretty much everything must be working for them to pass inspection.

However, one problem is that our car is so old that sometimes parts are simply not available. If we had this car in the U.S., we would long since have junked it, since repairs would have been prohibitively expensive or just plain impossible for lack of parts. But not here in Ecuador! Labor costs here are much lower than in the U.S., so that often the parts cost a lot more than the labor does. And if a part is simply not available, our ingenious and dependable mechanic can often rebuild it or even remake it from scratch.

This can also mean that, even if a part is available, it is sometimes cheaper to rebuild it than to buy it new.

Just to give an idea of how this works, just since August we have had the following car parts rebuilt or remade from scratch:

- ullet Our alternator: It was completely rewired. A new one would have cost \$400 just for the part, but this was just \$250 for parts and labor.
- Our universal joint: It was rebuilt. It broke because the driveshaft was bent and wobbling. Kind of exciting, going 50 on a highway, feeling a vibration, then hearing a huge bang. Thankfully there was an exit right there. God was taking care of us!
- Our driveshaft: It had gotten bent so that it wobbled, but we didn't realize it for a couple of weeks even after the universal got fixed, because it was only a problem at highway speeds. No similar driveshaft was available, so our mechanic found someone who has made it his specialty to remake driveshafts from heavy-duty pipe. It seems to work fine, though it has quite a different feel (and look) from the original. But I took it on a grueling 5-hour trip on steep, winding mountain roads to visit a Quichua village with Segundo, and we had no trouble!
- The entire driver's side electric window mechanism: That part was not available anywhere so the mechanic made it from scratch.

These are just some of the big items!
